



5 Ways to Wow: Our Outcomes for children at Kingswood



Our children will be able to leave Kingswood being able to converse.

I use an extensive vocabulary to add detail to my explanations and observations.

- Use vocabulary that reflects the breadth of their experiences.
- Use subject specific vocabulary when observing, and explaining facts.
- Vocab including positional language, times of day, mathematical language, concepts beliefs, describe locations, celebrations, scientific, movement, feelings
- Talk about their observations, and experiences, within both made and natural environments, using a wide vocabulary.



How you can support this:

- Introduce new and interesting words in conversation
- Talk about the meaning of new words
- Value uninterrupted talk time with your child
- Repeat unusual words, or repetitive phrases in stories ie 'Ginormous' or 'You can't catch me!'
- Read books
- Sing songs and rhymes







Our children will be able to leave Kingswood being able to care.

I have a positive sense of self so that I can independently participate in a small group, and the wider community.

Fasten shoes and coat

- Form relationships with their peers.
- Talk about people they know, what they see and how they are feeling.
- Aware of the feelings of others and respond thoughtfully.
- Know that plants and animals require care, food and/or water to grow and thrive.



How you can support this:

- Label the emotions your child is demonstrating ie 'I can see you're smiling, you look happy. I wonder why you are feeling happy?'
- Talk about the characters feelings in stories
- Encourage your child's growing independence ie putting on own shoes, pouring their own drink
- Read books that challenge stereotypes and represent a diverse range of experiences ie children with parents of the same gender, with different skin colours, from different countries, with disabilities
- Encourage your child to participate in taking care of plants and animals at home
- Encourage your child to contribute to keeping home tidy, and contribute to recycling







Our children will be able to leave Kingswood being able to make connections.

I can make links in my learning to deepen my understanding of the world.

- Engage in structured learning, that is not of their choosing.
- Notices and compare quantities, size, weight and capacity in their play
- Remember and recall detailed information and previous learning.
- Knows that there are up to 5 objects in a group without counting (subitise).
- Uses ways to measure in their play e.g. how many children will fit in a cardboard box
- Continue and copy a pattern.



How you can support this:

- Read, and look at non-fiction books together
- Point out features in the world around them ie seasonal changes, local building works, tiny plants growing in cracks in the wall, sorting the recycling
- Talk about past events 'Do you remember when...?' Photos can support this!
- Find different ways to achieve the same outcome, ie building a tower, cutting a sandwich into 4 in different ways
- Incorporate counting into your daily routine, number of stairs in the the house, numbers on your front door etc
- Play games with a dice; simple board games, actions according to number rolled, list of things to talk about



Our children will be able to leave Kingswood being able to be creative.

I relish participating in stories, music, songs or rhymes, and I use materials both imaginatively and with a purpose

- Begin to recognise familiar letters or words e.g. letters in their name, familiar names and shop signs.
- Hold a pencil effectively
- Write some recognisable letters
- Identify favourite books, songs, and rhymes.
- Recognise rhyming words they hear
- Retells familiar stories and repeats rhymes and songs
- Decides which materials to use, to fix and join.
- ▶ Use media, colour, form and technique effectively.



How you can support this:

- Read every day AND everywhere!
- Sing songs and rhymes DAILY
- Point out familiar print in the environment
- Use household objects or materials to create patterns, arrangements and structures
- Talk about preferences of songs heard on the radio or different playlists
- Talk about designs and art you see in the world around you such as interesting buildings, bridges and advertisements
- Encourage mark making wherever possible; crayons, bath crayons, sticks in mud, paintbrushes dipped in water, ice cubes etc







Our children will be able to leave Kingswood being able to be confident.

I can take risks, stay safe and willingly engage in new experiences.

- Confident to have a go and try new things.
- Be adventurous and confident in their physical play.
- Navigate the wildwood structure and dismount safely and confidently.
- To begin to understand and use the language of consent.
- Uses some strategies to access technology safely.



How you can support this:

- Play games to use the whole body, such as musical statues, funny dances, Chase, Hokey Cokey Song, Floor is Lava!
- Encourage your child to use and learn the words 'yes' 'no' and 'stop'
- Encourage your child to try new things:

Tastes, climbing equipment at the park, petting an animal

Encourage your child to participate in tasks that help them to be healthy such as :

- daily toothbrushing
- choosing a piece of fruit or vegetable for a snack
- looking both ways when they cross the road holding an adults hand
- only accessing tech when an adult is supervising
