Yesterday was our first No Waste Wednesday for packed lunches. Well doné to the six children, and their families, who did not have any packets or wrappers in their lunchbox!




Farm Animals

Serious Incident

We were most concerned to be alerted to an incident last week that took place near to school. A black Ford car, drove at great speed towards school, almost knocking another car, and traumatising the sibling of a child attending here. This could have been a fatal accident on our doorstep. The number plate of the car has been shared with us, and the driver identified as a parent of a child attending here.

This has been advised as a matter for the police to deal with.

The Kingswood estate has a speed restriction of 20mph because of the large number of children moving in a residential space, which includes 3 schools. Everyone in the community should adhere to this.

If you do drive to school please remember to park responsibly. The yellow zig zags at the front of school must not be parked on; they are not reserved for certain individuals.

Parents have also expressed concern at music played inside cars, very loudly, that feature lyrics that are considered offensive and are not appropriate for children to hear. Your help in turning down music as you approach school would be appreciated.
