You may well have seen recently in the news that some schools have been affected by the presence of RAAC in their buildings. RAAC, or Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete, is a lightweight form of concrete which was used in schools and other building construction from the 1950's until the mid-1990s. After some time and in some circumstances this concrete can collapse.

Kingswood was constructed at a time when RAAC was not being used in construction and we can therefore be confident that there is no RAAC present.

How can you make your child's lunch box healthier?
