







- Children's achievement is most effective when home and school work together and share information in order that children achieve their potential
- Unlike a physical, hard copy book, it's easy to share the online journal with groups of relatives, extended families, parents living apart and relatives living overseas
- You may see 'likes' from other members of staff This means that other members of the team are proud of your child's achievements – Remember all staff work with all children
- At the end of the school year, if you wish to print off a copy of the journal to keep, you will be notified via email when it is ready and you will be notified of the time frame to download and print before it expires



What do I need to do now?



- You will receive an email from Tapestry, check your junk mail
- Follow the link to sign up
- Make a note of your password and PIN (Keep it safe)
- Have a look and comment on what your child has been up to at Nursery or Pre School
 - Please upload photos from any home experiences such as holidays, trips to the shop, something your child has made and other WOW moments

Tapestry is a fantastic tool to use for family times, making your child feel valued and confident to share their learning with their friends and teachers

- A password is required to access Tapestry
- Hosted on Tapestry's own servers in a secure UK data centre
- Tapestry uses the same encryption as online banking, and our own firewall to protect the data we have
- Data is stored separately for each school
